- 1.1 Survey on Journalists
 - Survey method : Self-administered mail questionnaire survey;
 - Target respondents : Journalists working in Hong Kong;
 - Data collection period : Early January 2007 to 20 January 2007;
 - Total questionnaires sent : 1,484; .
 - Completed questionnaires returned : 506;
 - Response rate : 34.1%.
- 1.2 Survey on the General Public
 - Survey method : Telephone survey;
 - Target respondents : Hong Kong residents aged 18 or above;
 - Data collection period : Nights of 22 January 2007 to 26 January 2007;

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- Completed interviews : 734;
- Response rate : 47.1%.
